Sebastian Elsenbroek Georgia Aquarium Externship 9/30/24-10/25/24

I was fortunate to be able to spend a month with the Georgia Aquarium for one of my fourth-year externships. I had an amazing time there and really enjoyed getting to work with the team and all the different species.

While there I was able to participate in a number of different procedures. We did exams on freshwater stingrays, where I was able to practice with ultrasound and drawing blood. We had annual exams for all the sea otters, and I was actively involved in anesthesia monitoring and manual ventilation, along with assisting in the physical exam. I also assisted with anesthesia monitoring during a tumor removal for a roughtail stingray. For box turtle annual exams, I did full physical exams. I also helped monitor anesthesia and provide manual ventilation during an Asian small-clawed otter cystotomy surgery. At the end of each day, we would also check the mortality fridge for any potential necropsies, which I would perform with the doctor on duty.

In addition to these procedures, I followed the veterinary team around for their various exams and treatments. I was able to observe in penguin bootie changes, dolphin subcutaneous fluid administration, various desensitization sessions, team meetings, journal clubs, zebra shark exams, and CT exams. I also spent half days in different departments like the environmental health and water quality teams, the clinical lab, and at the off-site holding and quarantine facility. During my last week I presented to the animal health team on the topic of cetacean transfusion medicine as well.

This activity showed me the inner workings of a large aquarium and a better idea of what an aquarium veterinarian career looks like. It increased my interest in aquatic animal medicine and my desire to work in an aquarium one day. I love the variety that comes each day between species, procedures, and responsibilities. I enjoy getting to interact with the various departments and trainers and getting to form relationships with those people. I like the educational aspect of it as well, interacting with the public and tour groups and visiting students/doctors. We also brought in multiple specialists for procedures like echocardiogram and surgery, and I enjoyed getting to collaborate with doctors from different fields of medicine. I think aquariums play an important role in ocean conservation and education, and I would love to help contribute to that role someday.
